We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2016-17 educational progress for the Cass City Jr./Sr. high School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2016-17 school year, schools were identified using new definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has three or more underperforming student subgroups. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as not being given a label.

One of the key challenges facing schools is the availability of consistent, timely and reliable data to help chart student growth. Currently there is a change over to MSTEP and SAT testing which is still in its infancy. Until we have 3 or more years of this data to compare, it is difficult to get a gauge of where you are at. However, in the meantime, we are focusing our efforts into utilizing AIMSWEB, Khan Academy as well as a couple of other local assessments to assist in filling in the gaps until that data is available.

-Students who live in the district and have been identified as 7-12 graders are eligible to be assigned to Cass City Jr./Sr. High School. Cass City Schools does participate in Schools of Choice for grades 7-10.

6. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES

-Fall Parent/Teacher Conferences 2017-2018, 19% of our students had parent representation.

-Fall Parent/Teacher Conferences 2016-2017, 21% of our students had parent representation.

7. FOR HIGH SCHOOLS, ONLY ALSO REPORT ON THE FOLLOWING:

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- a. There were 19 students equating to .04% of our student body were enrolled in dual enrollment classes.
- b. We offered four (4) Advanced Placement courses.
- c. There were 46 students equating to 10.5% of our student body enrolled in AP courses.
- d. There were 32 students of the 46 eligible students who took the AP test for college credit. Twenty one (21) students equating to .049% of the student body passed the AP test.

We are confident that our school is moving in the right direction. With these changes, we will continue to be a leader in student achievement.
