Xello is an engaging program that helps students with selfknowledge, exploration, planning, and preparing for the next steps in life. Whether students are interested in trade options, colleges, universities, entrepre-

neurships, or other training, Xello can help prepare for any path a student may desire. Through a series of self-assessments, students are matched up with

careers best suited for their learning style, personality style, skills, as well as general likes and dislikes. Students can explore a wide range of information regarding any career they choose. Information such as job description, working conditions, job tasks, salary, job demand, and education and training are all available for each career. Similar careers are also provided within each career option. Students are able to see educational options for their career as

well as the requirements to get accepted. Additionally, Xello is paired with Google Earth so students have the ability to take virtual tours of future educational options. These virtual tours allow students to see dormitories, dining halls, classroom facilities, sport complexes and much more. Though this feature is

interesting and engaging, the post secondary planning option is exceptional. Students have the ability to add various experiences such as work, volunteer, education, and life (trips, awards, performances, etc). Post-secondary plans



#### Helping Red Hawks Soar Higher

The Cass City PROMISE Team (consisting of Cass City community members) is excited and pleased to announce the roll out of a new program supporting all Cass City Public Schools kindergarten through twelfth grade students. The Red Hawk NEST EGG, beginning during the 2020-2021 school year, is geared to enhance after-high school (postsecondary) opportunities for all students. Each student will participate in activities that will increase goal setting, career planning, and financial capabilities; and will be provided with a long-term savings account (with a \$50 initial deposit) that can be used toward college or trade school expenses.

Specifics regarding this program will be available to all families in September of 2020. The Cass City PROMISE Team is currently seeking Cass City alumni, community members, service clubs/businesses, or any other interested individuals as partners in this effort. 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## Asthma support for Cass City students

Asthma can adversely affect a child's school performance, health, and wellbeing and is the leading cause of absenteeism nationwide. Cass City Public Schools is working o implement the School-based Asthma Management Program (SAMPRO) in partnership with Hills and Dales General Hospital. SAMPRO has four components that can improve communication, education, and the school environment. The first and main component is to establish the circle of support. The circle of support consists of the family, clinicians, school nurse, and the broader community (teachers, coaches, school environment, community leaders, and community groups). The child is the central focus in SAMPRO.

SAMPRO aligns with our coordinated school health efforts of the Whole School, Whole Community,

Whole Child (WSCC) model. The WSCC model places the child in the center with the goal of the child being safe, healthy, engaged, challenged, and supported. This focus promotes the long term development and success of the whole child with greater integration of health and education to improve the child's cognitive, physical, social, and emotional development. There are ten focus areas or building blocks that a school needs to develop to have a healthy school environment (see WSCC model). These focus areas fall into four categories in the school environment. They are categories that support healthy student behaviors, school health services, safe and positive environments, and engaged families and communities. The ability to achieve a focus on the whole child is a collective effort that involves all of the school staff, parents, and community.

Many of our students have social, emotional, and physical needs and come from socially disadvantaged homes. Some have chronic health conditions, such as asthma. The Cass City Public Schools district has a full time registered nurse in the district because of a partnership with Hills and Dales General Hospital. Implementation of the SAMPRO program is one way that the school and the community are working to meet the goal of having our students be safe, healthy, engaged, challenged, and supported. Our school is fortunate to have many other community organizations that come along and support our students.

#### Pinney Foundation helps to provide clean clothes for all

Cass City Jr./Sr. High School as well as the social and emotional committee would like to extend their sincere appreciation and gratitude to the Pinney Foundation. Through this special grant, the social and emotional committee was able to purchase a washer and dryer. These appliances will be used to wash donated items for our clothing closet as well as provide students the opportunity to bring in their own clothes to wash.

## BUILDING FOR THE FUTURE

The Advanced STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics) class have been working on bridges as part of the Michigan Department of Transportation (MDOT) Bridge Building Competition. The challenge requires students to build bridges to specific guidelines with a limited amount of balsa wood, glue, and string. The bridge with the highest strength-toweight ratio wins the challenge. Also, as part of the challenge students need to have documentation of their building process and evidence-based explanations for the decisions that they made in building their bridge. Students document their work, calculations, data, plans, and tests as part of their

proposal. The proposals will be submitted to MDOT for review. Once MDOT has read over the proposals they select the groups for the statewide competition later this year in Grand Rapids. Students have been busy researching, building, and testing their bridges.

#### **Red Hawks in Review**

The fall sport season was an exciting one defined in large part by the success of the Red Hawk Football Team. The football season was historic, having achieved greater success than ever before in our school's history. The squad finished the regular season with an 8 -1 record earning their second consecutive Greater Thumb West Title. The success continued into the postseason as the Hawks earned their first ever district and regional championships with playoff wins over Sandusky, Lakers, and Detroit Loyola. The run came to an end in the state semifinal against Jackson Lumen Christi. The Thumb Sports Writers' Association named the football team as the team of

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the year, while awarding Jeremy Velasquez the defensive player of the year. In addition, the MHSAA named Scott Cuthrell as the Regional Coach of the Year.

In addition to football, the Red Hawks found success in Cross Country. Nick McArdle and Riley Copeland, both juniors, qualified for the state cross country meet and earned a spot on the Top 10 leaderboard amongst the fastest cross country runners in our school's history.

Claiming the Greater Thumb West league title once again this year, the Cass City/USA Soccer Co-op earned their way to the district final by defeating Frankenmuth in the semifinal in a shoot out, as regulation ended in a 0-0 tie. Their season ended with a loss in the district final to Flint Powers. In addition, volleyball also secured a spot in their district final by beating Bad Axe before falling in the final to USA.

Cass City continues to participate in a swim co-op with Caro Community Schools. Prior to the start of the season, the Caro Community said goodbye to a valued coach of 26 years in Woody Cruthfield, having lost his battle to cancer. Caro Community Schools honored him and his years of service by naming their natatorium in his memory. We are incredibly appreciative of Dave Sutton, Cass City parent, who willingly filled this coaching void, enabling our swimmers to have the opportunity to compete this year on their swim co-op.
