support in place to include: Tier I instruction with 80/85% of students achieving identified instructional targets; supplementary intervention supports for students

Students will tested three times a year using college and career readiness benchmarks. Students not meeting or exceeding benchmark will be placed in an intervention program administered or supervised by a paraprofessional or classroom support teacher. The paraprofessional will work with students one-on-one or in small group settings (3-5 students) based upon skill deficiency(ies), as well as the direction and recommendation by the classroom teacher.

If a student that has been identified gets in trouble they will be sent down to talk with their behavior staff member. If student is given an in-school suspension, they will serve it with their behavior staff member.
